

Summer Jobs at CAE

Thank you for your interest in summer opportunities with The **Cambridge Academy of English (CAE)**. CAE is an independent accredited language school. We are not part of a large chain and we take pride in our friendly, personal and professional approach to teaching and learning.

In addition to our year-round activity catering for adults and groups of teenagers, we operate **residential and homestay summer courses** for international children and teenagers aged **8 to 17 years**. These courses offer a personal integrated programme of language classes, afternoon activities, evening entertainment and visits, and are tailored to the needs of the different age groups.

We employ summer staff for a number of different roles – **EFL teachers; activity leaders; lifeguards and senior staff**. Most summer positions are residential, with some **non-residential EFL teaching and activity assistant summer positions** available at our year-round Cambridge school.

All courses have **fixed start dates**. Class size is limited to **12 students**. We don't accept group bookings in summer. Our **nationality quotas**, and an **excellent 1: 6 overall staff: student ratio**, ensure a safe and enjoyable English teaching and learning experience for staff and students.



CAE is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

We do not appoint without interview, require proof of id and sight of qualifications and a minimum of two references. Enhanced DBS or Police checks will be requested.

We ask all staff to comply with our Code of Practice and to work towards a positive summer experience for staff and students.

CAE offers the opportunity to extend and develop your portfolio of skills within a supportive, hard-working and professional environment. All staff are expected to share our commitment to safeguarding and continuing best practice.

Non-Residential Summer Positions

EFL Teachers (non-residential)

- ✓ deliver the academic programme
- ✓ plan, prepare and **teach up to 21 hours** per week
- ✓ are expected to **plan motivating, appropriate** lessons closely linked to the activity and excursion programme using a variety of resources relevant to the age group
- ✓ work as a team, attend INSET and staff meetings

Social Activity Assistants (non-residential)

- ✓ deliver the **afternoon and evening programme**
- ✓ run well-organised and safe airport **transfers**;
- ✓ plan, prepare, supervise afternoon and evening activities and evening and weekend **excursions**
- ✓ take an active role on the programme especially concerning supervision, and liaising closely with other staff
- ✓ can expect to work **35 to 45 hours** per week (hourly paid)

Residential Summer Positions

ALL residential course staff

- ✓ live at the centre and contribute to the academic, social and pastoral wellbeing of the students
- ✓ are involved with **excursions** and **airport transfers**
- ✓ are accommodated in **single rooms** in boarding houses
- ✓ assist with pastoral duties and are expected to contribute to the spirit of their house
- ✓ attend an **Induction programme** and contribute to **staff development and feedback** systems
- ✓ work closely within a **team**
- ✓ have an **area of special responsibility** - defined by experience, interest and the needs of the course
- ✓ **work a 6-day working week** and are entitled to a 24-hour period of leave per week

All CAE staff have a **professional duty of care** and are expected to display an enthusiastic professional, mature and responsible attitude to working with children.

Residential positions (cont ...)

In brief,

EFL Teachers

- ✓ deliver the **academic programme**
- ✓ plan, prepare and **teach up to 20 hours** per week.
- ✓ are expected to **plan motivating, appropriate lessons** closely linked to the out of class and excursion programme using a variety of appropriate resources
- ✓ participate in **afternoon and evening activities** and accompany students on **excursions**

Social Activity Teachers

- ✓ deliver the **afternoon and evening programme**
- ✓ plan, prepare, supervise afternoon and evening activities
- ✓ organise evening and weekend **excursions**
- ✓ take an active role on excursions, especially concerning supervision and liaising closely with all other staff
- ✓ may teach up to 10 hours per week as required, (and depending on relevant qualifications)

House Parents

- ✓ are responsible for the pastoral **welfare** of the students
- ✓ assist the CD with the checking of all rooms and inventories and are responsible for the set up/ close down of the house at the start and end of the course.
- ✓ set up and manage procedures for pocket money, room allocations, keys, security, laundry, house meetings
- ✓ keep accurate student records
- ✓ foster a spirit of well-being
- ✓ ensure a system of effective house supervision & discipline.
- ✓ **plan, prepare and supervise afternoon/ evening activities.**
- ✓ take an active role on excursions

Activity Assistants

- ✓ provide administrative support to the House Parents and Senior Staff team as necessary
- ✓ are responsible for the course noticeboards and display areas and for maintaining the tidiness of shared areas
- ✓ play an active role on the Social Activities team
- ✓ offer specialist skills: lifesaving; sports coaching or others

The residential Senior Staff team

Course Directors (CD) lead the senior staff teams responsible for student and staff welfare and the effective delivery of the CAE residential summer courses.

Senior staff positions are management positions requiring the motivation and skills of mature, organised, practical and flexible team players. Senior staff build and maintain a positive, happy, hard-working atmosphere on site.

Relevant EFL experience working with children and teenagers, leadership skills and IT competency are essential.

The Director of Student Services (DSS)

- ✓ co-ordinates the student **transfers**
- ✓ is responsible for the **afternoon and evening social programme** of activities and entertainment
- ✓ works with DOS to plan and deliver successful excursions
- ✓ manages the Social Activities team
- ✓ is responsible for student and staff welfare and discipline
- ✓ acts as **co-deputy for CD** as required

The Director of Studies (DOS)

- ✓ is responsible for the **academic programme**
- ✓ works with DSS to plan and deliver effective excursions
- ✓ organises the induction and placement of the students
- ✓ teaches up to 15 hours per week as required
- ✓ manages the EFL teaching team
- ✓ is responsible for student and staff welfare and discipline
- ✓ acts as **co-deputy for CD** as required

The Course Director (CD)

- ✓ is ultimately responsible for all aspects of staff and student welfare and discipline
- ✓ ensures that the course delivery meets CAE standards
- ✓ manages and deploys staff and inspires a high degree of professionalism
- ✓ liaises closely with Senior Staff team and with DYL
- ✓ provides induction training and on-going support for all staff
- ✓ is responsible for managing the local course budget
- ✓ is responsible for student pocket money accounts (with HPs)
- ✓ is first point of contact with Host School representatives
- ✓ maintains the reputation of CAE through direct contact with parents and agents as required

Members of the CAE year-round team maintain daily contact with all four summer centres. They visit regularly and are available for support, advice, on-going training and quality assurance.
